5th Grade

- 1 two-pocket homework folder
- 1 homework planner (weekly format - with space to write your homework each day)
- 2 two-subject spiral bound notebooks
- 1 pair of headphones (nothing fancy - Chromebook accessible)
- 1 box of pencils and mini sharpener
- 1 box of colored pencils
- Post-Its (at least 1 package)
- Reusable water bottle
- 1 computer mouse (wired or wireless)

6th Grade

Humanities

- 2 in. Binder
- Dividers
- 2 Composition notebooks
- Folder

Math/Science

- 1.5 in. or 2 in. Binder
- Metric Ruler

Supplies used in both 6th grade classes:

For Math:

Scientific calculator – TI 30XS can be found in most office supply stores or online. (graphing calculator Ti-84 optional for 8th grade algebra - check Ebay, Amazon and other auction sites for used. Many college students buy for one course and then resell only slightly used at a much lower price.)

Colored pencils or markers and at least one highlighter

One set of dividers

One 1" or 1.5" plastic flexible three ring binder.

Two composition books

A ruler that will sit on the rings of a binder

Three spiral bound notebooks with 1/4" graph paper (quadrille ruled) - Staples carries the best of these. They have lighter grid lines that are easier to write on neatly.

1 Large notebook (not composition)

Post-it notes (all colors welcome!)

For 7th Grade Humanities:

1 ½" or 2" binder and one set of dividers

2 composition books

Looseleaf paper

1 2-pocket folder

Reinforcements

For 8th Grade Humanities:

1 ½" binder

1 composition notebook/journal

1 set of dividers (5)

2 sturdy pocket folders

2 yellow, 2 green, 2 purple & 2 orange highlighters (to leave in class)

For Spanish

One 1 inch 3 ring binder

Looseleaf paper

One 2-pocket folder

Optional Supplies:

Spanish/English dictionary

Locker shelves and other organizers and decorations (no stickers, and note that lockers are not magnetic)

Reinforcements

3 hole punch that fits in a binder

Protractor, compass, ruler, white out
